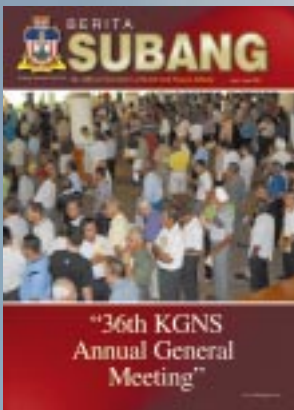

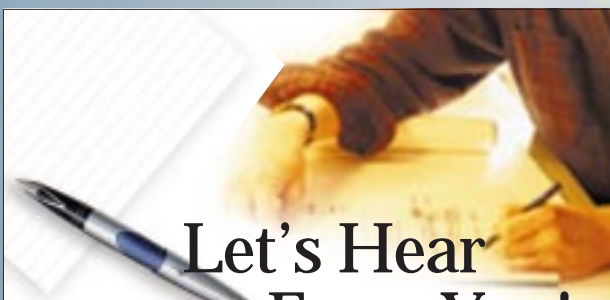

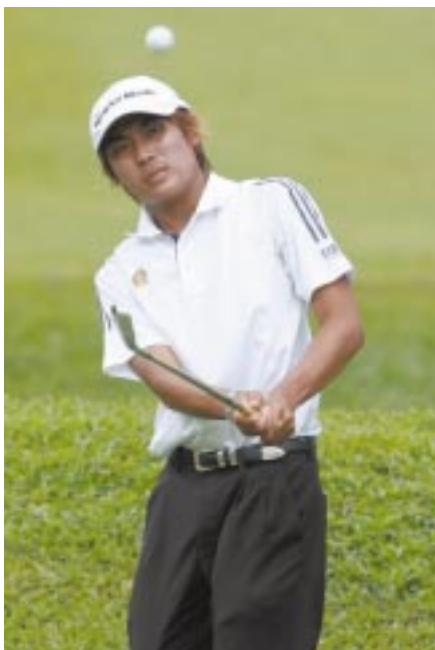
106th Malaysian Amateur Open

Syabas, Arie!

An international field of 126 golfers from 18 countries, including Malaysia, turned out at the 106th Malaysian Amateur Open staged from 22nd to 25th May 2008 at the Putra Course, Kelab Golf Negara Subang. The home contingent was by far the largest with 56 golfers whereas, at the other end of the scale, single entries came from Australia, Northern Ireland, South Korea and Hong Kong. Making its debut in this part of the world was the team from Bahrain, comprising scratch golfers Sultan Abdulla and Khalid Ahmed.

Day 1

With sunny skies above and the occasional breeze, our very own national player Nicholas Fung made the most of his hot putter to card a 66, the end result of a barrage of 7 birdies and 1 dropped shot. Just one stroke off the pace, though, was another national golfer, Muhammad Arie Irawan, and Filipino Ferdinand Aunzo. Miri-born Arie, who is no stranger to KGNS, relied on his sound short game and putting prowess to offset his drives. However, it was Ferdinand who posed the bigger threat, having clinched victory at the

Karambunai Amateur Open earlier in the month and just the week before, beat Nicholas and Arie at the Sabah Amateur Open.

Day 2

Rebounding from a somewhat sluggish start, Muhammad Arie held his nerve to turn in a 2-under round of 70 for a single-stroke advantage over overnight leader Nicholas Fung, who ended with an even-par 72. Taiwan's Lee Kuan-hung shot the day's best score of 68, having achieved an eagle at the par-5 17th. He finished 3rd to tie with New Zealander Daniel Pierce at 139. Three strokes adrift was Filipino Ferdinand Aunzo at 3-over 75, which placed him 4th together with Malaysian international Hilmi Abd Rahman and Thailand's Idtiphat Silasuwan.

At this point in the proceedings, 80 golfers made the cut to advance to the weekend whilst Malaysia, ably represented by Muhammad Arie Irawan and partner Akmal Tarmizee Nazri, claimed the first trophy of the championship, i.e. the team competition, with a combined 7-under 281 total, 3 strokes better than New Zealand's Daniel Pierce and Sean Riordan.

Day 3

With the course set up to play longer and tighter, and difficult pin placements to boot, the going got tough on Saturday for all and sundry, over-night leaders included! Philippines' Dante Becierra had a 4-under 68 (made up of 5 birdies and 1 bogey) and a total tally of 211, which earned him a 1-shot lead over Muhammad Arie. Unfazed by the "Subang challenge", Malaysia's Kenneth de Silva carded a 2-under 70 and a total of 213 to move up to 3rd spot on the leaderboard.

Day 4

Going into the final day 1-shot back did not unnerve Muhammad Arie, who saved par on the finishing hole to triumph by 2 strokes at the 106th Malaysian Amateur Open. Overnight leader Daniel Becierra slumped to 75, whereas compatriot Jhonnell Ababa made headway to take 2nd spot with a total of 285. It was a 4-way tie for 3rd place between Taiwan's Tan Huang, Ferdinand Aunzo, Nicholas Fung and Dante Becierra, who all ended the championship at 286.

Matchplay Championships



Day 1

Unable to sustain his form of the previous day, Muhammad Arie Irawan was eliminated 2 and 1 by Australian Paul Mews in the 2nd round. Eight other Malaysian golfers also suffered early exits from the matchplay championships, leaving only two survivors, Iszaimi Ismail and Alex Tiong, to soldier on! The former has taken out Mithun Perera of Sri Lanka to claim a berth in the quarter-finals while Alex ousted fellow Malaysian Hilmi Rahman 2 and 1. The day, though, belonged to Filipino Dante Becierra who, determined to make up for losing out in the Malaysian Amateur Open, went on to trounce Malaysian Mohd Ilyia Jamil 6 and 5, followed by a 7-up win over Singapore's Mitchell Slorach in the afternoon.

Day 3

Facing Philippines' Dante Becierra in the finals, Singaporean Koh Dengshan had a less-than-anticipated uphill climb, as was the case in the semis, to claim victory. Concluding the morning round with a 3-up advantage, the 20-year-old Koh was 6-up midway in the afternoon before his opponent launched a brave comeback effort, which was "too little, too late". In the fight for 3rd place, Malaysian Alex Tiong did well to overcome Australian Paul Mews with a 1-up win.

Day 2

A battle with Philippines' Dante Becierra, who won 1-up at the day's end, put paid to Alex Tiong's campaign for yet another Malaysian podium finish. Earlier in the morning, Becierra scored a similar win over Indonesian Andik Mauludin. In the final showdown, the in-form Filipino would meet Singapore's Koh Dengshan, who had to claw his way through a testy 1-up morning encounter with Filipino Peter Villaber (decided at the 20th hole!) and, later, get past Australian Paul Mews, also with a 1-up win.

At a press conference on Wednesday, 19th June 2008, called for 11.00 a.m., the KGNS Ladies Captain and the Chairperson of the Organising Committee, Cik Rosmimiee Abbas, officially launched the inaugural KGNS Ladies Amateur Open scheduled for 30 June to 2 July 2008. In the media statement, she announced that the new event would henceforth replace the Selangor Ladies Amateur Open. Traditionally, KGNS has been the host venue for the Selangor Ladies Amateur Open, which has been a popular fixture in the Malaysian golfing calendar for many years, drawing avid participation from both foreign and domestic lady golfers. In a bid to revive the fortunes of the Selangor Ladies Amateur Open and its time-honoured traditions, the KGNS Ladies Golf Committee has initiated the KGNS Ladies Amateur Open to serve as a worthy replacement for the former while maintaining, in the transition, its original aims and aspirations. The inaugural championship will be a permanent fixture in the KGNS golf domain and be wholly organised by KGNS. The Open is a 2-day competition with a practice round

36th KGNS Annual General Meeting

The 36th Annual General Meeting of Kelab Golf Negara Subang convened at 10.00 a.m. at the Dewan Tunku on Sunday, 22nd June 2008. With 812 members in attendance, the order of business for the assembly included:

- receiving the Presidential address
- election of office bearers for the ensuing year (2008/2009) for:
 - (a) President,
 - (b) Vice-President,
 - (c) Captain, and
 - (d) Five (5) Management Committee members.
- considering and, if thought fit, approving ordinary resolutions for:
 - (a) proposed construction of a new Course and Grounds Maintenance Building at a cost not exceeding RM2.0 million
 - (b) proposed construction of irrigation ponds at Holes 5 and 7, Putra Course, at a cost not exceeding RM700,000
 - (c) ratification that:
 - senior members be exempted from paying inter-club surcharge
 - absent ordinary members, upon application and approval, pay only 50% of the monthly subscription for ordinary members.

The outgoing President, Y Bhg. Dato' Ir. Donald Lim Siang Chai, remarked in his address that the preceding year was eventful with its share of "highs and lows", including:

- KGNS being polled, the "Best Private Member Club".
- KGNS being selected as the host venue for the 106th Malaysian Amateur Open and Malaysian Matchplay Championships, with prospects of being the same for the 2011 Malaysian Open.

- land issue, as yet unresolved with the Government.
- the transferability of membership, pending to date.

In the ensuing election, conducted from 10.30 a.m. to 12.00 noon and with a total of 1037 votes cast per portfolio, the following were voted into office:

President : Tan Sri Dato' Seri Megat Najmuddin Megat Khas
 Vice-President : Prof. Dr. Jalani Sukaimi
 Captain : M. Harris Kudus B.M. Yunus
 Committee : Dr. Ronnie Yeo
 S. Kuldip Seine
 Md. Noor Ayob
 Peter Murray
 Jagjit Singh Bhatt

However, the 4th (Peter Murray) and 5th (Jagjit Singh) placings were not immediately filled. These are left vacant for 2 members who are in the service of the Federal Government.

In considering the Report of the 2007/2008 Management Committee, the meeting deliberated, at some length, the pros and cons of constructing a new course and grounds maintenance building, i.e. the viability of expending RM2.0 million as opposed to the practicality of upgrading at a reduced cost. The house resolved to opt for the latter course of action. The resolution for the irrigation project at the Putra Course, however, was approved. The meeting also endorsed the issue of the transferability of membership, giving leave to the incoming Management Committee to draw up the appropriate by-laws and initiate implementation.



New Faces on the KGNS Scene

Since mid April 2008, three new faces have joined the KGNS Management line-up, namely the General Manager, the Golf Manager and the F&B Executive. These key appointments have been occasioned by resignations in the respective positions earlier in the year. In this issue of Berita Subang, we are pleased to introduce them to the KGNS community.



Muhammad Johan bin Abdullah, General Manager

Muhammad Johan bin Abdullah, 57, comes to KGNS with a bagful of experience accumulated over his many years in the hospitality industry. This Kuching-born East Malaysian of Bidayuh extraction holds a Diploma in Resort and Country Club Management from Canada and was an associate member of the Club Managers Association of America.

In his early years, he was a senior flight attendant with Malaysia Airlines. After which, he went to Australia to further his studies in Business and Marketing Management. Upon graduating, he worked for five years as part of the management team of a corporate resort in Victoria. He then returned home and landed the post of General Manager at Octville Golf

and Country Club, Johor, from 1996 to 1999.

After a brief attachment to PGA (UK) Golf Academies, Johan's next appointment was Assistant General Manager of the Mines Resort Golf Club. His responsibilities included start-up operations for the Borneo Heights Resort, developed by Country Heights Holdings Bhd. In 2001, Tropicana Golf and Country Resort beckoned him to serve as General Manager until his 'retirement', when he was appointed the Golf Management Consultant to Saujana Scapes and Greens.

Johan's vision for KGNS is very much attuned to that of the Club, i.e. "making KGNS the premier membership club in the country". To this end, his plan is to steer the management team towards service excellence and delivering expectations.

K.R. Devindran's path to KGNS (for the second time around!) was also backed by an equally impressive track record. It began in August 1990 with a nine-year stint at the Royal Selangor Golf Club as the Senior Golf Starter/Supervisor in the Golf Department. He then moved on to KGNS in February 1999 and served as the Golf Executive for two years.

Since then, the father of three has been with Bukit Unggul Country Club as the Golf Executive and Miri Golf Club as the Golf Activities Consultant. Along the way, the 41-year-old Kuala Lumpur resident also acquired a Professional Diploma in Sports Management. Before rejoining KGNS, he was again with the Royal Selangor Golf Club for two and a half years.

The immediate tasks for Devindran, or Devin for short, upon his re-entry into KGNS were to revitalise the Golf Department and to hasten the preparation for the 106th Malaysian Amateur Open/Malaysian Matchplay Championships, the TSM Challenge and the inaugural KGNS Ladies Amateur Open, as well as the staple trophy events and Monthly Medals!

It has been a rather hectic schedule but, Devin is taking it all in his stride. Indeed, in his own words, his aspirations for KGNS are to "improve and bring changes to the Club so as to provide excellent services to KGNS members in line with its status as the "Most Prestigious Golf Club".



Mohd Zaki bin Abd Ghani, Food & Beverage Executive

In his 22 years in the hospitality/food and beverage business, 48-year-old Zaki has more or less covered the length and breadth of the country learning his trade. Having completed a Diploma in Hospitality at the NPC in 1986, he began his career by tending bar at the Dayang Hotel, Petaling Jaya, and then trekked north to Penang, waiting tables at the Orchid Hotel's Fine Dining Restaurant. His subsequent and key move was to the Banquet Department of the Equatorial (which, at that time, had Penang's largest ballroom that could sit 1,500) where, from 1989 to 1993, he was made the Captain and later the F&B Assistant Supervisor.

A short stint as the F&B Captain at the Concorde KL followed before he headed north again, to serve as Management Trainee at the Penang Mutiara Beach Resort, and later east-

bound to serve as the Assistant Manager at Awana Kijal Hotel and Golf Resort – all in the years 1995 to 1998. The Santini Restotante Italiano was his next place of work, where he served as the Assistant Manager from 1999 to 2001.

Soon after, he opted for a self-employed stint in his hometown Seremban, specialising in the Indonesian fare (nasi padang). Zaki's last two appointments prior to KGNS were with Swiss Inn KL and, then, as the F&B Coordinator of Ancasa Hotel Spa KL from 2005 to 2007.

He has a three-fold plan for the KGNS F&B Department, namely:

- to introduce a wide variety of food selections
- to upgrade the standard of meals and services, and
- to achieve the highest profitability for the Department, especially in the banqueting sector

Course & Grounds Sub-Committee

In its continuing commitment to improving course playability and enhancing the aesthetics of golfing at KGNS, the Course and Grounds Sub-Committee has undertaken a number of initiatives to achieve these ends. As advised by the Course Superintendent, Encik Shamsul Bahrin, projects, large and small, in the pipeline cover both the Kelana and Putra Courses, as follows:

1. Kelana Course

The Kelana fairways have, in past, always been susceptible to being soggy during the wet season or after rainy spells, resulting in water-logging, reduced playability and a lot of plugged balls. As reported in the January-March issue of *Berita Subang*, corrective measures were taken to improve drainage with the construction of water traps/drain sumps. Now, as an added effort to overcome the problem, the Course Maintenance team will be “top-dressing” the fairways, by laying on sand up to a depth of 2 inches over a scheduled period of time.

With soil improvement in mind, the sand will both give firmness to the ground and act as a buffer between the earth underneath and human traffic above. The blanketing of the fairways with sand will, however, be done for strategic locations only, i.e. projected ball-landing areas instead of from tee to green. At the time of writing, work has begun on Fairway No. 9 and will progress to other affected holes in due time.

Fairways Top Dressing at Kelana Course

Reasons:

1. To prevent soggy areas on the fairway
2. To prevent ball-plugging during play
3. To prevent late opening of the course after rain

Note: Buggies are not allowed during wet season.

Details of work:

1. Identifying the soggy areas especially at the line and ball-landing areas
2. Top dressing with sand targetted at 2 inches high after several top dressings
3. Stopping the mowing of grass in order to let the grass hold the sand

2. Putra Course

At the recommendation of the MGA, all tee boxes will be levelled and re-planted with Zoysia, from the existing Cowgrass, due to its hardiness and aesthetics. This exercise has already been started at Hole No. 5.

Tee Box Upgrading

Reasons:

1. To prevent uneven tee boxes
2. To change the grass from Cowgrass to Zoysia to enable KGNS to host bigger tournaments such as the Malaysian Open
3. To beautify the tee boxes as Zoysia grass, which is darker in colour, can be mowed shorter than Cowgrass

Details of work:

1. The blue area of tee box No.5 being used as a trial.
2. If successful, the exercise will cover the entire blue tee boxes in stages.

3. New Course and Grounds Maintenance Building

The proposal for the construction of a new Course and Grounds Maintenance building was not approved at the 36th KGNS Annual General Meeting and therefore the alternative will be to upgrade the existing facilities.

Hole Review



Kelana Course Sultan's Nine Hole No. 8 505 metres (par-5)

Blue	: 505 metres
White	: 458 metres
Red	: 415 metres
Index	: 7

This is a classic double dogleg hole that plays from a slightly elevated tee box, which demands a long carry to a narrow fairway bending to the left. Big hitters like to carry a fairly large bunker on the fairway's left centre to be in position to attack with their second shot.

Two obstacles lie in wait for this second shot. A formidable pond lurks on the green's left side and players must avoid a hidden bunker that guards the putting surface's right front portion.

The hole is designed to be played with a drive to the right of the fairway sand trap. A second shot is to a narrow fairway pinched by trees on the left and a hillside on the right, and then a third shot into a well protected green. This is much easier to execute and while it may only occasionally produce a birdie, it can also present double and triple bogeys.

My Shanghai Experience

• 8 – 15 March 2008

Shanghai, the gateway to the Yangtze River basin, was an ideal trading port where the British first opened their concession in 1842 after the first Opium War. This was followed by the French in 1847 and the Japanese in 1895 – each in turn parcelling the city into autonomous settlements. By 1853, Shanghai, effectively a Western invention built on trade in opium, silk and tea, had overtaken all other Chinese ports.

The Chinese Communist Party (CCP) was born here in 1921. After numerous setbacks, finally in 1949 CCP 'liberated' the city known as 'the Sin City' by eradicating slums, swindlers, drug runners, gangsters and backstreet pimps but in the process, put the city to sleep! To bring back its former glory, the city began a massive renovation project in the late 90s, turning it into a pedestrian-only shopping extravaganza. Today, Shanghai – Paris of the East – is a thriving metropolis with a population of 13.2 million and an area of 6,340 sq km, which is ten times the size of Singapore! (*Source: The Lonely Planet*)

Day 1 to 3: Shanghai

The French Quarter, or *Xintiandi* in Chinese, glitters with huge department stores such as Isetan, Printemps and Parkson, cafes, boutiques, odd antique shops and some of the best architecture – old art décor apartments, neo-classical mansions and villas with quaint balconies and doorways. The hunt for cheap mobile phones with TV facility brought us to another part of the city and

five floors of retailers selling mobile phones. We bought two at a price which was one-third of the price in KL! A word of advice: watch your pockets, look disinterested and bargain hard!

Next stop was the Children's Palace, a fantastic idea for children aged between 4 and 16. Here they can develop skills in IT, engineering, medicine, art, dancing, music, and others during the weekends and after school hours at a nominal cost.

We were treated to orchestra and ballet performances, with young participants in the latter having to cut short their recess just to entertain us, four senior citizens, with their precision and vigour! In the evening we attended and thoroughly enjoyed a must-see wholesome acrobat show with the tagline: "If you miss this, you haven't seen Shanghai."

Day 3 began with a visit to the Oriental Pearl Tower, an inspiring piece of architecture, for a sensational view of Shanghai. However, the haze put paid to our excitement as visibility dropped to only 1 km! The Shanghai History Museum, located at the base of the tower, recreates the Shanghai of the pre-1949 era.

After an Indian lunch, we proceeded to the Yu Garden. This rock garden was nurtured into existence by the Pan family, a rich official between 1559 and 1577 during the Ming Dynasty. Adjacent to it is the Yu Garden Bazaar, which is full of antiques, souvenir shops and delicious snacks, so much so it resembles a Disneyland of historical China!

Day 4: Suzhou

Suzhou, pronounced as 'sujou', has a population of 5,749,900 and is widely known for its gardens, canals and a famed silk centre. This city is known as the Venice of the East and its canals are connected to the world's longest waterway, the Grand Canal, which runs from Hangzhou to Beijing 1,800 km north.

We took a trip to the New Economic Zone, an industrial and residential area

beautifully planned and developed by Singaporeans. It is adjacent to a very large man-made 'Golden Cock' Lake with a well laid-out and manicured park. The key features of Suzhou's gardens are rocks and water and, like the Zen gardens of Japan, there are few flowers.

Our next stop was Choyers, Suzhou's No. 1 silk mill, with a big showroom that sells a wide variety of silk items.

Day 5 to 6: Hangzhou

With a population of 6,114,000, Hangzhou (pronounced as 'hang jou') is three hours drive southwest of Shanghai. 'In heaven, there is paradise; on earth Suzhou and Hangzhou', so says one of the tourist brochures. Of the three cities we visited, Hangzhou is by far the most beautiful and serene, with classical architecture, tree-lined streets and, of course, the West Lake. All these make Hangzhou a lovely place to be.

After a wonderful meal of Peking duck at a Muslim restaurant, we visited the Leifeng Pagoda, a memorial constructed a thousand years ago to commemorate the legend of the White Snake Princess. According to local folklore, a white snake princess from the 'upper world' came down to earth only to fall in love with a man. A monk, who felt that it was wrong for an immortal to marry a mortal, turned her back into a snake and hid her beneath a temple, but not before she bore a son. This son grew up and rescued the mother, and the family lived happily ever after. No further reference to the whereabouts of the monk was mentioned. The original

pagoda was replaced with a grand seven-storey pagoda a few years ago and from the top, we had a magnificent view of the West Lake and its shores.

A light morning drizzle on the sixth day did not deter us from taking a cruise on the West Lake. It was a blessing as the view with white mists swirling around was like a Chinese scenery painting! We later took a leisure walk in the beautifully designed park, its gardens tendered with

loving care.

Next was a visit to the Dragon Well tea plantation in Mei Ji Wu village. It is said that drinking Dragon Well tea is like taking a stroll in the clouds! After a sales talk by a beautiful Hangzhou girl at the tea centre, we ended up buying 1 kg of purportedly China's best tea!

In the evening, we went to the esplanade to watch a free musical fountain show. Water jets are located in the lake itself. With the lake as the background and foreground, the lighting, water formation and music were simply a superb combination.

Day 7: Shanghai

We visited the Bund, an assortment of neo-classical downtown New York-style and monumental antiquity. Known as Shanghai's Wall Street, The Bund dates back to the 20s. Not far behind it is the Chinese City, a maze of narrow lanes, lined with closely-packed houses. We then moved on to Nanjing Road, China's golden mile.

In the evening, we took a boat cruise along the Huangpu River which separates the Bund from Shanghai's Central Business District, the construction of which started eighteen years ago on former farmland. Today, it is at least five times the size of the CBD of Sydney, and development is still continuing at a rapid pace. Buildings on both sides of the river are fully lit on Friday and Saturday evenings for the benefit of boat cruisers. That was the grand finale of our visit to Shanghai.

Ashraf Ahmad Shakil

The SMK Taman SEA student, who turned 16 in January this year, started out at the tender age of 7. He was interested in the game because “it was a new sport” and “something I could do with my Dad”. With a golf nickname of Ash, he plays to a handicap of 4 and his favourite professionals are Geoff Ogilvy and Tiger Woods. However, Ashraf is not totally consumed with golf as his other pastimes include football, online games and music.

How good is his game? Well, his drives, as he puts it, are “250 metres consistently” and the best part of his golf is chipping! He plays on weekends, is coached on his long game on Saturday afternoons while weekdays are reserved for the short one, i.e. approaches and from around the greens. This explains how his “three greatest golf achievements” (as he calls them) – 1st placing at the 2004 Penang Junior Open, the same at the 2007 KGNS Junior Golf Championships and the 2007 MSSS Gold Medal – came about! For 2008, he took the top spot at SportExcel Johor and finished in the top 16 at the recent Malaysian Amateur Open.

Ashraf’s career goal is to be an accountant, which will be a “gimme” in golf parlance, given his commitment and dedication!

A somewhat ‘late’ starter, Daniel took to playing golf at age 11 and, a year later, began playing seriously once he secured his handicap in December 2004. There was no looking back as he got into the “many junior events in and outside of KGNS”. His first

Our Daniel is a busy lad but his time is well spent honing his skills in his bid to excel in golf, which is what champions do!



Gavin Green

Gavin is a third-generation golfing Green, with grandparents and parents who are very much into the game! His first real encounter with golf was at the KGNS Driving Range and it was Dad who clued him in on the basics. Gavin's talent came to the

fore four years later when he finished ninth out of 30 in Group C at the 2001 KGNS Junior Year End Competition! That was his first-ever try at competitive golf and his flight mates then were Dinie Zikri and David J Augustine.

The passion and love for the game took hold and with Pro Kenny Reutens as his coach and guide for five months, Gavin went on to make his indelible mark in golf by winning an awesome seven out of eight Junior Bi-monthly Medals in 2003 and by capping that with the Nett Champion's title at the Junior Year End Competition. Encouraged by these achievements, he persisted in his winning ways in the ensuing year, working diligently at his game as his "golf accomplishments continued to progress".

In 2005, young Gavin was comfortably playing to a single-digit handicap – quite a feat for a 15-year-old! Today, he is a 7-handicapper and relishes, with well-earned pride, the "30 golf tournament victories in hand". He has this to say: "I am very glad and proud to be in the KGNS Junior Elite Team. I feel very honoured to represent KGNS in any tournament."



Rizal Azli

The 'baby' of the squad, who is not yet 14, began his love affair with golf at 3! Motivated by the PGA Tour on TV, he started playing the game in earnest and, at the age of 6, took part in a junior golf tournament at KGNS ("a gruelling nine holes!") with an entourage of family members (all non-golfers) in tow. Playing with another notable KGNS junior golfer and now friend Mohammad Hisyam, he finished fourth in the no-handicap age group. That status changed quickly when he was assigned one at the age of 6.

Rizal reckons his best moment in golf was when he was selected as the Most Talented Young Golfer at the 2002 Sarawak Junior World Masters (with a card of 75,

Dinie Zikri

Having recently turned 17 in June, Dinie Zikri is already an old hand at golf with 11 years of the game, mostly competitive, under his belt! He started out when he was 6 and a year later, he played in his first-ever tournament, the KGNS

Year-End Competition. Back then, he came under the tutelage of his first coach, Rabbani, which led to, among other things, him being assigned a valid handicap of 24 when he was 10 years old and, more importantly, his "coming of age" in the game when in-born talent speaks for itself.

Whilst still in primary school, he began making the rounds of junior golf, journeying through and growing from strength to strength in the competitive arena. All of these contributed to a growing number of inspiring achievements for this lad, which included the following:

In the midst of all that, he also participated actively in the Selangor Amateur Open, the Selangor Tour Circuit, the Philippines Open 2005, the Singapore Invitational Open 2007 and the TSM Golf Challenge. His special moment in golf, though, was achieving his hole-in-one on 20th January 2007 (a date forever etched in his memory, no doubt!) at the 7th Hole of Sultan's Nine off the blue tee with a 7-iron.

For now, however, Dinie would like to remain as a fair player as he wants to study first. Turning pro is also an option to be considered in the future.

My Best Golf Moment

During the 2002 Sarawak Junior World Masters, I was selected as the Most Talented Young

Golfer of the tournament. I finished 2nd in the Under-8 category. I played 75, 72 and 64. I holed a 60-foot birdie putt on the last and threw the ball into the crowd like my idol Tiger Woods!

I was also sent by the Malaysian Golf Assosation (MGA) to Hong Kong in 2004 and became the youngest boy to be selected to represent the MGA in local and international tournaments.

My Future Plans

Most likely I will transfer to a school in Australia, Hills International College, next year (2009).

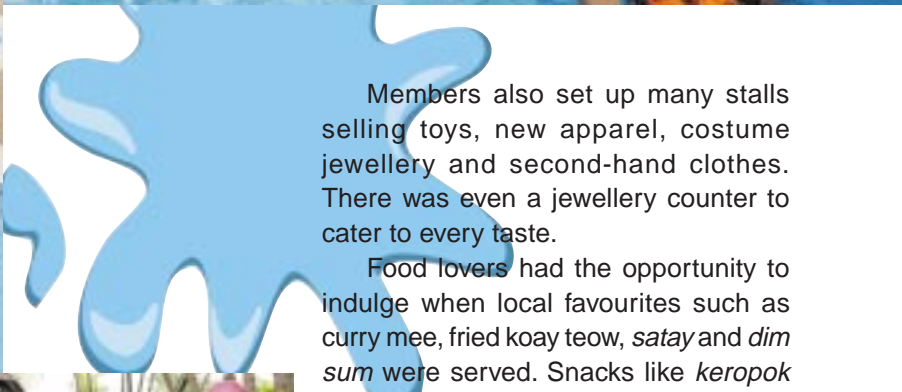

Eraliammah a/p Kuppan Machine Operator, Course & Grounds Department



At 53, Puan Eraliammah is blessed with 4 children, 3 of whom are married with families of their own, and is a senior member of the Course and Grounds Maintenance crew. Along with another colleague, her key tasks, since her designation as machine operator in 1991, are to clean, machine-rake and set bunkers on both the Putra and Kelana courses. Since foliage abounds in KGNS and with the current weather patterns, there is the added chore, she remarked, of sweeping and removing dead leaves, dried twigs and other debris before tending to the bunker sand itself.

This, however, is routine in dry and sunny conditions – the crunch comes when the course is both rain as well as wind-swept! Then, she has to contend with wet and/or flooded compacted sand in a total of (count them!) 63 bunkers for the Putra Course and 50 for Kelana! It is a race against time as there are only that many hours in the workday but the grandmother of 5 is unfazed by the challenge, having seen it all in her 33 years of service with KGNS.

Puan Eraliammah's first sight of KGNS was back in 1975 when, at 18 and already a mother of one, she started out as a field worker doing a variety of jobs, from weeding of greens to re-planting of turf, landscaping and general maintenance. She recalls that what we now call "Kelana Jaya" was

then the Seaport Estate rubber plantation (of which KGNS was part), the Federal Highway was but a country road linking KL and Klang and Sungei Way was just a sleepy township.

Her most vivid memory of KGNS was the unbelievable sight of the horrendous havoc wreaked on Putra by that thunderstorm a couple of years ago. The complete closure of the course and the immense task of cleaning up after were unprecedented in KGNS history but the incident itself will always serve as a reminder of Nature's fury. To a query by *Berita Subang*, Puan Eraliammah indicated that, with retirement looming, she plans to take a well-deserved rest and spend more time with her retired lorry driver husband, her children and grandchildren.
